Oct. 7, in hoophouse.

Seeds started: Mar 11 Set Out: May 15 First Ripe: July 13 First frost: Sept 23. Completed harvest: Oct 11



Habaneros

Oct 22. Harvested from hoophouse.

One plant produced over 100 peppers.

Nov. 13 Carrots, parsnips, beets, celeriac, and kohlrabi just harvested.
